In Re: Translation of P-140's Report of February 15, 1921.

Facts Developing:

Following instructions received from Special Agent [Charles J.] Scully, I translated P-140's report for February 15, 1921, which is written in German. The report translated into English reads as follows:

I beg to report that I established the fact that it is the intention of the United Communist Party to try to establish within this year the Dictatorship of the Proletariat. It is namely known that the local factions of the Third International are receiving from Moscow all the directions. It is the intention of the Communists of Europe to celebrate the 1st of May with a general strike and the Communists of America adopted the same program. I was informed by the people who are members of the Communist Party to the effect that the laborers of this province are provided with arms.

It was my intention to visit the communistic groups of other nationalities, but inasmuch as I already established the fact that the same opinion prevails among all the groups, I will with your kind permission

investigate the Hungarian group only.

In the morning at 8:30, I visited the Hungarian Workingmen's Home as at that time a meeting of the leaders too place. At the same time a strike committee was organized.

For "tactical reasons" the leaders of the factions will be replaced by others and the new ones will be elected as delegates to the next convention of the Communist Party, which, according to the present plans, will be held February 24th, 1921, at 7 East 15th St.

I have to call attention to the steamer "Argentine" of the Cosulich Line from Trieste, as some propaganda literature will be brought from Vienna to this port on said steamer. This information I obtained from Neider, who also notified me that the literature will be brought to this port by a certain Alexander Foder.

I will also mention a few new points in connection with my investigation of the Wall Street explosion. I was always positive that the outrage was done by the communists, but now I obtained proofs to that effect. The young man who is known only under the name of "Rudy" told me that a great deal of this affair is known to the "comrades" in Detroit, who are the most revolutionary elements.
