"Referendum A, 1916," proposing that the Socialist Labor Party be invited to send representatives to a conference for the purpose of working out a basis for the amalgamation of the Socialist Party with the Socialist Labor Party, has passed by a large majority, the vote being 20,650 in favor and 4,495 against. The committee to represent the Socialist Party at this conference will consist of L.E. Katterfeld, George H. Goebel, S.E. Beardsley, Thomas W. Williams, and Walter Lanfersiek. The official report on this referendum is as follows:

Report on Referendum "A," 1916.

That the Socialist Labor Party of the United States be invited to elect a committee composed of 5 of their members to meet in joint conference with a committee of 5 members to be elected by the National Committee of the Socialist Party.

Said joint conference shall meet within 2 months from the time of their election and work out a basis and agreement that provides for the amalgamation of the Socialist Party and the Socialist Labor Party in one organization.

Such agreement to be submitted to the two national organizations not later than June 1, 1916, and then immediately by said national organizations be submitted to a referendum vote in the respective organizations for ratification or rejection.
